OKLAHOMA CITY (Oct. 17, 2022) — The Institute for Responsible Alcohol Policy (IRAP) has hired Samantha Davidson Guinn as its president.

Davidson Guinn has worked in government affairs for private companies and within state government and is a policy expert. She previously oversaw Gov. Kevin Stitt's policy and legislative agenda, and she most recently served as deputy attorney general and chief of policy within the Office of the Oklahoma Attorney General. As a member of the President Pro Temp's office, Davidson Guinn was an integral part of modernizing Oklahoma's alcohol laws in 2016.
